Lesson Four:

The Simple Past Tense

(Be : Was , Were)

The simple Past Tense is used principally to describe events in the past

1/Be : Was /Were in the positive ,negative and interrogative form:

Positive	Negative	Short Form Negative	Interrogative Form
I was	I was not	I wasn't	Was I ?
He was	he was not	He wasn't	Was he ?
She was	She was not	She wasn't	Was she ?
It was	It was not	It wasn't	Was it ?
We were	We were not	We weren't	Were we ?
You were	You were not	You weren't	Were you?
They were	They were not	They weren't	Were they?

***Examples:**

1/Ten minutes ago the Captain and the Mate **were** on the bridge.

2/The Mate **was** angry because the two deck hands were not around.

3/It **was** midnight but I wasn't very sleepy.

4/**Were** you in the galley half an hour ago? No, **was** in my cabin.

5/**Was** the Captain angry about the mistake? Yes, he **was** very angry.

***Questions and Short answers:**

-Was the Second Mate in his cabin?	Yes, he was	No, he was not (wasn't)
-Were the men ready to dock?	Yes, they were	No, they were not(weren't)
-Were you in the apprentice on the "Eva"?	Yes, I was	No, I was not (wasn't)
Was the captain's wife on board?	Yes, she was	No, she was not (wasn't)
Were you in the rescue team?	Yes , we were	No, they were not (weren't)
